2. Pathways/ admission

Completion of NSW Higher School Certificate with an ATAR of no less than 65, or the completion of the interstate or overseas equivalent qualification and result, or equivalent;

OR

Completion of a Certificate IV or higher qualification awarded under the Australian Qualification Framework by an authorized institution or registered training organization.

OR

Mature age entry (21 years and over) can apply for provisional entry. They will need to successfully complete their first 4 subjects to be permitted to continue without this restriction.

3. Course Rationale

The Bachelor of Ministry (currently accredited as the 'Bachelor of Contemporary Ministry') is designed to prepare graduates for ministry within Church and community settings. The BMin aims to integrate a well developed foundation in Christian Studies with a broad and coherent theoretical and practical knowledge in an area of specialised ministry. General skills in communication and problem solving are developed alongside specialist knowledge and expertise in their chosen major, including Pastoral Ministry, Cross Cultural Ministry, Worship Ministry, Youth & Children's Ministry, and Leadership and Management. Theories are applied and professional skills are developed through practical assessments and work-integrated learning. Each major includes a special emphasis on leadership to ensure that graduates are instilled with a sense of responsibility and the Christian ethic of caring for their neighbour. In this sense, the BMin acts as an integrated environment for the preparation of students who wish to develop theological understanding and professional skills in and for a diverse range of ministry applications. This also can take them on to postgraduate qualification in a selected area of practice.

5. Course Structure:

TITLE OF COURSE OF STUDY:

BACHELOR OF MINISTRY

Structure of the course of study: The course structure is based on six semesters (each of 13 weeks duration), with four subjects taught in each semester. It comprises:

- 8 compulsory common first year core subjects in Christian Studies
- 8 subjects in the Major (specialisation)
- 8 electives

To qualify for award of the degree of Bachelor of Ministry a candidate shall accrue an aggregate of at least 240 credit points, including satisfactory completion of the core subjects noted below.

Maximum of 8 subjects (80 credit points) at 100 level, and at least four subjects (40 credit points) at 300 level. Students must complete at least 2 subjects (20 credit points) in professional experience.
