Course Structure of Study

The Bachelor of Applied Social Science comprises of:

- 15 Core Subjects
- 7 subjects in an area of specialisation (Major)
- 2 Elective subjects

To be eligible to graduate with the Bachelor of Applied Social Science degree a candidate shall accrue at least 240 credit points, including satisfactory completion of the rules noted below.

- Minimum of 6 subjects (60 credit points) at 300 level
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Area of Specialisation – Majors

 - Social Science

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Elective Subjects

If you have completed the requirements of a Major, any additional units completed within another major is classified as an elective subject.

Any unit that is not within the Bachelor of Applied Social Science award is classified as an elective subject. Before enrolling into an elective subject, ensure that you have met the pre-requisite for that unit.

For example, MAN201 Organisational Behaviour is a unit outside of the Bachelor of Applied Social Science award. You must meet the pre-requisite by completed MAN101 Introduction to Management.

If you have selected to complete the Counselling Major, your elective subjects must be subjects within the Applied Social Science award.
