# ASSOCIATE DEGREE IN MINISTRY

## Course Duration

Full-time load 2 years  
Part-time up to 8 years

## Study Modes

Face-to-face, online, intensives

## Intakes

Semester 1, Semester 2

## Course Structure

The course structure is based on four semesters (each of 12 weeks duration, plus an exam week), with four subjects taught in each semester. It comprises:

- 9 core subjects (90 credit points)
- 1 Professional Practice (10 credit points)
- 6 electives (60 credit points)

To qualify for the award of Associate Degree in Ministry a candidate shall accrue an aggregate of at least 160 credit points, including satisfactory completion of the core subjects.

## WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

### Elective Subjects

Any unit that is not within the Associate Degree in Ministry award is classified as an Elective subject. Before enrolling into an elective subject, ensure that you have met the pre-requisite for that unit.

*For example, MAN311 Strategic Management is a unit outside of the Associate Degree in Ministry award. You must meet the pre-requisite of 120 credit points and completed MAN101 Introduction to Management and MAN201 Organisational Behaviour.*

Be aware that there are 7 x 100 level units as part of your core subjects. If you have completed more than 8 x 100 level units, only 8 x 100 level units will count towards the course progression within the Associate Degree in Ministry.

Any additional completed 100 level units will be extra electives on your transcript and will not contribute towards your course progression of the Associate Degree in Ministry.

### Course Levels

100, 200 or 300 level is indicated in the course code e.g THE201 is a 200 level theology unit, whereas LEA301 is a 300 level leadership unit. The units increase in difficulty and build upon content and concepts that have come before.

### Pre-requisites

A pre-requisite is a unit that must be successfully completed before attempting another unit. For example, in order to attempt THE201, you must complete THE101. Students must have completed the pre-requisite to enrol in the subject.
