# BACHELOR OF APPLIED SOCIAL SCIENCE

## Course Duration

Full-time load 3 years  
Part-time up to 10 years

## Study Modes

Face-to-face

## Intakes

Semester 1, Semester 2

## Course Structure

The course structure is based on six semesters (each of 12 weeks duration, plus a study week), with four subjects taught in each semester. It comprises:

- 15 compulsory core subjects (150 credit points)
- 7 subjects from the specialisation focus area/ major (70 credit points)
- 2 elective subjects (20 credit points)

To qualify for award of the degree of Bachelor of Applied Social Science a candidate shall complete at least 240 credit points, including satisfactory completion of the core subjects and satisfactory completion of the rules noted below:

- Minimum of 6 subjects (60 credit points) at 300 level

## WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

### Elective Subjects

If you have completed the requirements of a Major, any additional units completed within another major is classified as an elective subject. Any unit that is not within the Bachelor of Applied Social Science award is classified as an elective subject.

Before enrolling into an elective subject, ensure that you have met the pre-requisite for that unit.

*For example, MAN201 Organisational Behaviour is a unit outside of the Bachelor of Applied Social Science award. You must meet the pre-requisite by completed MAN101 Introduction to Management.*

If you have selected to complete the Counselling Major, your elective subjects must be subjects within the Applied Social Science award.

### Course Levels

100, 200 or 300 level is indicated in the course code e.g THE201 is a 200 level theology unit, whereas LEA301 is a 300 level leadership unit. The units increase in difficulty and build upon content and concepts that have come before.

### Pre-requisites

A pre-requisite is a unit that must be successfully completed before attempting another unit. For example, in order to attempt THE201, you must complete THE101. Students must have completed the pre-requisite to enrol in the subject.
