Course Structure

The Bachelor of Ministry award comprises of:

- 11 Core subjects
- 8 subjects in an area of specialisation including a professional practice unit
- 5 Elective subjects

To be eligible to graduate with the Bachelor of Ministry award, a candidate shall accrue at least 240 credit points, including satisfactory completion of the rules noted below.

- Maximum of 8 subjects (80 credit points) at 100 level
- Minimum of 4 subjects (40 credit points) at 300 level

Area of Specialisation

To be eligible to graduate with the Bachelor of Ministry, ensure that you complete the requirements of the Ministry or Chaplaincy area of specialisation.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Elective Subjects

If you have completed the requirements of a Major, any additional unit completed within the major or other major is classified as an Elective subject.

Any unit that is not within the Bachelor of Ministry award is classified as an Elective subject. Before enrolling into an elective subject, ensure that you have met the pre-requisite for that unit.

For example, MAN311 Strategic Management is a unit outside of the Bachelor of Ministry award. You must meet the pre-requisite of 120 credit points and have completed MAN101 Introduction to Management and MAN201 Organisational Behaviour.

Course Levels

100, 200 or 300 level is indicated in the course code e.g THE201 is a 200 level theology unit, whereas LEA301 is a 300 level leadership unit. The units increase in difficulty and build upon content and concepts that have come before.

Pre-requisites

A pre-requisite is a unit that must be successfully completed before attempting another unit. For example, in order to attempt THE201, you must complete THE101. Students must have completed the pre-requisite to enrol in the subject.
