Course Duration

Full-time load 1.5 year Part-time up to 7 years

Course Structure

The course consists of 120 credit points, comprising:

- one research methods unit: 20 credit points (Core);
- two 20 credit point subjects, at 600 level, to be taken from the area of specialisation (Major);
- 20 credit points, at 500 level or above (Elective);
- one 40 credit point research project (20,000 words) in area of discipline (Core).

To qualify for award of the degree of Master of Theology a candidate shall accrue an aggregate of at least 120 credit points, including satisfactory completion of the rules noted below.

Elective unit(s) is to be a minimum level 500 subject and may be taken from any Program (e.g., Social Science, Education, business). There are two exceptions to this: i) language, where a 400 level introductory subject may be taken, and ii) a 400 level subject may be taken as 500 level by special arrangement with the lecturer (usually with additional reading, assessments, etc.)

Area of Specialisation (Major)

The following are Major's offered in the Master of Theology. A candidate is to select one major and complete the requirements:

- Biblical Studies
- Theology
- Ministry

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Elective Subjects

Any unit that is not within the award is classified as an elective subject. Before enrolling into an elective subject, ensure that you have met the pre-requisite for that unit.

For example, if you are to enrol into COM505 Intercultural Communication, which is outside of the Master of Theology award, this will be classified as an elective unit.

Course Levels

100, 200 or 300 level is indicated in the course code e.g THE201 is a 200 level theology unit, whereas LEA301 is a 300 level leadership unit. The units increase in difficulty and build upon content and concepts that have come before.

Pre-requisites

A pre-requisite is a unit that must be successfully completed before attempting another unit. For example, in order to attempt THE201, you must complete THE101. Students must have completed the pre-requisite to enrol in the subject.
