Full-time load 6 months Part-time up to 1.5 years

Course Structure

The course structure is based on one semester (of 13 weeks duration), with four subjects taught in the semester (for a full-time study load). It comprises:

- 20 credit points of core subjects
- 20 credit points of elective subjects

To qualify for award of Undergraduate Certificate in Community Services a student shall accrue an aggregate of at least 40 credit points, including satisfactory completion of the core subjects noted below.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Elective Subjects

In this award, students may choose elective subjects from Biblical Studies. Before enrolling into an elective subject, ensure that you have met the pre-requisite for that unit.

Course Levels

100, 200 or 300 level is indicated in the course code e.g THE201 is a 200 level theology unit, whereas LEA301 is a 300 level leadership unit. The units increase in difficulty and build upon content and concepts that have come before.

Pre-requisites and Co-requisites

A pre-requisite is a unit that must be successfully completed before attempting another unit. For example, in order to attempt THE201, you must complete THE101. Students must have completed the pre-requisite to enrol in the subject. A co-requisite is a unit that can be studied concurrently with another unit.
