GRADUATE CERTIFICATE IN WELLBEING STUDIES

Course overview

The Graduate Certificate in Wellbeing Studies is a flexible course that will teach you the psychology of emotion and wellbeing, as well as allowing you to choose from a broad range of social science topics.

Course Duration

Full-time load 6 months Part-time up to 2 years

Course Structure

The course structure is based on one semester (13 weeks duration), with four subjects taught in the semester. It comprises:

• 4 core subjects (40 credit points)

To qualify for award of the degree of Graduate Diploma in Counselling a candidate shall accrue an aggregate of at least 40 credit points including completion of the core subject and three electives.

What you need to know

Elective Subjects

Any SSC unit that is not classified as a core unit within the Master of Counselling award is classified as an elective subject.

Before enrolling into an elective subject, ensure you have met the pre-requisite for that unit.

Pre-requisites

A pre-requisite is a unit that must be successfully completed before attempting another unit. For example, in order to attempt SSC514, you must complete SSC412. Students must have completed the pre-requisite to enrol in the subject.

Course Levels

400 or 500 level is indicated in the course code e.g., SSC410 is a 400-level Social Science unit, whereas RES500 is a 500-level Research unit. The units increase in difficulty and build upon content and concepts that have come before.
