Course Structure

Th MA course structure is based on three semesters, with 4 subjects taught in each semester, comprising:

- 20 credit points of compulsory core subjects
- 50 credit points of subjects in the major (specialisation)
- 40 credit points of elective subjects
- 10 credit points of capstone subject

To qualify for award of the degree of Master of Arts a candidate shall complete at least 120 credit points, including satisfactory completion of the core subjects and rules noted below.

 Maximum of 6 subjects (60 credit points) at 400 level

Area of Specialisation (Major)

The following are the Majors currently offered in the Master of Arts. You are to select one major and complete the requirements:

- Christian Studies
- Chaplaincy
- Counselling
- Discipline

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Elective Subjects

Any unit that is not within the award is classified as an elective subject. Before enrolling into an elective subject, ensure that you have met the pre-requisite for that unit.

For example, if you are to enrol into COM505 Intercultural Communication, which is outside of the Master of Arts award, this will be classified as an elective unit.

Course Levels

100, 200 or 300 level is indicated in the course code e.g THE201 is a 200 level theology unit, whereas LEA301 is a 300 level leadership unit. The units increase in difficulty and build upon content and concepts that have come before.

Pre-requisites

A pre-requisite is a unit that must be successfully completed before attempting another unit. For example, in order to attempt RES501, you must complete RES401 and 40CP in the course major. Students must have completed the pre-requisite to enrol in the subject.
